Match the food item with the appropriate culture. Then include a discussion on where that culture is represented in Waterbury (by neighborhood).

From the neighborhoods map, make a puzzle from the neighborhoods, and unidentified, have the children ID them and place them in their proper places on the map.

Take a quote from Crownbrook or Brooklyn and delete all but neighborhood signifiers.

Read the quote to the students and ask them to tell you which neighborhood the quote was from. [Make sure that the quote has recognizable icons, people, etc]

Map Q&A

example:

Q: If you were in the center of Brooklyn and went directly east, which neighborhood would you be in?

A: South End

Q: Your best friend lives in Bunker Hill and you live in Crownbrook. Which neighborhood(s) would you have to go through to get to their house?

A: You'd have to go through either Hillside or Overlook.

This could be a larger problem solving section within class or as homework.
